**CITY OF PONDERAY
LOCAL OPTION NON-PROPERTY TAX**

Shall the City of Ponderay, Bonner County, Idaho adopt the proposed ordinance providing for imposition and collection, for a period of eight (8) years from its effective date, certain non-property taxes this way:

A seven percent (7%) hotel/motel room occupancy tax on all short term (30 days or less) rental charges for hotel rooms, motel rooms, condominium units, tourist homes, bed and breakfast establishments, RV Parks, and similar facilities.

The anticipated revenue for the seven percent (7%) hotel/motel room occupancy tax is anticipated to be Two hundred thirty-five thousand dollars (\$235,000.00) annually, and will be used in the following ways:

- a.) City infrastructure, capital projects and public transportation.
- b.) Street overlays, sidewalk repair, extension and replacement, additional bike paths and parks and recreation.
- c.) Public safety services.
- d.) Property Tax Relief Fund.
Per Idaho Code, any excess revenue received will be placed in a designated property tax relief fund.
- e.) Administrative Costs.
The city will retain the actual cost of collecting and administrering the tax.
